Today, we met with our event medical team to discuss the ongoing safety concerns from the LBGTO community. The medical staff as well as the entire community of Fayetteville is 100% committed to providing the best medical care for all participants at our upcoming events in Arkansas.

I want to make it abundantly clear that no participant, regardless of their gender identity, sexual orientation or race will be denied medical attention, whether onsite or at our host hospital in Fayetteville while racing with us. Hate and discrimination should have no place in America, and certainly not at our events.

Additionally, the US Cup has been in contact with NWA Equality.Org in Fayetteville, a local LBGTO activist group. The series will be making a donation to help them continue their efforts to fight for equality in any way they best see fit.
